GAPS Dissertation Award

The GAPS Dissertation Award is granted once every two years and recognizes an outstanding doctoral thesis that advances and expands in an exceptional manner the analytical and/or theoretical approach to Anglophone literatures around the world, to the study of varieties of the English, or to other postcolonial cultural forms, practices, and media.

The award is endowed with \in 2,000 and can be split among several doctoral theses. It will be awarded for the fifth time at the annual convention of GAPS in May 2022. In addition to the monetary prize, the award includes expenses for travel to the conference (via train, economy class), hotel accommodation for the night of the award ceremony, and the conference fee for the annual GAPS conference. After consultation with the Series Editors, the prize-winner(s) will be given the opportunity to publish their dissertation in the Association's publication series.

Who can nominate candidates for the award?

Doctoral advisors who are members of GAPS can nominate candidates for the award. Submissions by the candidates themselves are also possible, provided that they are themselves members of GAPS. Eligible for submission are excellent dissertations in the field of Anglophone postcolonial studies that were completed in the years 2020 and 2021 (this refers to the date of the last doctoral examination).

The entry deadline for nominations is the December 1, 2021. Dissertation projects completed between December 1 and December 31, 2021 can be nominated until January 5, 2022.

How does the nomination process work?

Nominations will be addressed to the GAPS board of directors, which will forward them to the jury-members. A nomination includes:

- a copy of the doctoral thesis and a copy of the Ph.D. certificate or a confirmation of the completion of the doctoral examinations from the dean's office,
- an academic c.v. of the nominee together with a list of publications,
- the advisors' reports,
- a short summary of the doctoral thesis in English (1,000 words).
